

6. Grammar in-a-nutshell: Linking words

Expressing Reason: because, as and since.

- Introduce the reason for something
 - Goes at the beginning or in the middle of a sentence:
 - They have inspiring lives as/because/since they achieved their goals
 - As/because/since they achieved their goals, they have inspiring lives.
- ** If they go at the beginning, there is usually a comma in the middle of the sentence.

Because is stronger than as and since, but they are often used in a similar way.

Because is used to answer Why-questions.
